We have passed on all complaints to the police and they will be monitoring parking outside the school gates on a routinely basis.

They are not expected but very much appreciated by all, your kindness has been overwhelming. We hope you have all had a wonderful break with you families and look forward to a brand new term and year ahead of us.

We try not to close the school as we are very aware that


