We are really excited and pleased to announce that we have now received our brand new Power Maths resources in KS1. This is a Mastery approach programme to Mathematics and includes online support in addition to textbooks and workbooks. This resource is very expensive but we believe will have a big impact on children's learning in Mathematics. The idea is that all children have access to mastery and are able to embed their learning before moving onto the next concept and it is based on the Singapore strategy. The materials are really child friendly and have already piqued the children's interest which is fantastic. Some year groups are using the workbooks as homework, but can I ask you all as parents to please ensure that your children care for these books and return them to school on the day asked. These books are very expensive and we are unable to replace lost books without a contribution from parents so please look after of them. 

Remembrance Day

Armistice Day is on 11th November and is also known as Remembrance Day. It marks the day that World War One ended, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month, in 1918. A two minute silence is held at 11am to remember the people who have died in wars. There is also Remembrance Sunday every year, which falls on the second Sunday in November. This year it will fall on Sunday 12th November. On this day, there are usually ceremonies at war memorials, cenotaphs and churches throughout the country, as well as abroad. The Royal Family and top politicians gather at The Cenotaph in Whitehall, London, for a memorial service. The anniversary is used to remember all the people who have died in wars - not just World War One. This includes World War Two, the Falklands War, the Gulf War and conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq. At school we take the time to observe the two minute silence and also have a special assembly to remember those

who have lost their life. I enclose a poem by Col. John McCrae which we share each year called "In Flanders Field" and we will once again be selling Poppies in support of the Royal British Legion. Money raised through the Poppy Appeal is used to help servicemen and women who are still alive, whose lives have been changed by wars that they have fought in. It might help them to get jobs and somewhere to live, and will also help older war veterans with any support they may need. It is also used to help those who have lost loved ones because of wars.
