We have been lucky this year with a good winter so far which has enabled us to be outside for sports, playtimes and lunchtimes. The children have been bringing some fabulous home learning in to school such as the amazing robots in year 2. I spent time looking at projects with the children who enthusiastically showed me their efforts, I thought the home learning projects have been brilliant and quite rightly the children felt very proud to show them off.

We came back very early in January so we have already achieved a lot as we move into February. I would like to spend a little time reflecting on January and sharing the highlights with you. We entered the Peterborough writing challenge with our team and made it to the finals. We also took part in many sporting events.

We as a school value the contribution that visits and residential make to the education of our pupils. We invest time in planning and staffing residential visits from year 2 to year 6 in each year group. As well as this we have planned a KS2 Skiing Trip to France. The pupils are fortunate as many schools do not offer the wide range of trips and visits but staff and I feel they are a very important part of our pupils' education. Payment plans, Pupil Premium reductions and opportunities to pay over prolonged time scales ensure all pupils have the opportunity to take part.

Clubs have been well attended and the Club lead Miss Nicholls will be collecting and updating the website this month to show you some of the amazing opportunities your child has taken part in so far this year.

We will be hosting a Quiz for families after half term and four pupils are currently working on this event as Quiz Masters thank you to Charlie, Henry, Seren and Tiegan for all of your hard work.

We have continued to offer access to the Computer suite from 8am every morning and breakfast for year 5 and 6 to have access to online learning and support. This has been well attended and children have shown amazing independent learning as well as having a free breakfast.

The year 3 had a wonderful time at Flag Fen and returned after going back in history to become stone age people for the day and learning about life at the time.

The year 4 have planned their Morphus and Nonsense Days around the Harry Potter books and are bringing this to life with many different activities including a day a Harry Potter world.

Year 6 had a growth mindset day with motivational workshops which they thoroughly engaged in and are applying to their school attitudes to learning. They have also been evacuated as part of their topic this term on WW2 to answer the big question – was it better to be evacuated or stay in the city? What do you think?

Year 5 have a wonderful day planned at the Jorvik center and this has been planned to enhance their topic work this term.

Year 2 are getting packed this month ready for their first residential visit to Stibbington a local Eco center which promotes healthy outdoor living. Later this month the children will also visit the Peterborough museum as part of their topic.

Sadly we continue to have a number of residents asking us to help them with issues linked to parents irresponsible parking. Thank you to the PTA, Governors and to all of the Parents who come into school to help us on a regular basis. I would also like to say thank you to a number of parents who have donated paper, card, games and prizes as well as other useful resources to the school – Thank you this is very kind of you and makes such a difference to the pupils and teachers.

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We will be hosting a Valentines disco for the pupils to fund raise for the school. If any parents would like to help the staff and PTA please could you let your class teacher know as we need additional help to make the evening very special for the children. We will also be selling valentine biscuits and a letter has been sent home for you to purchase your own iced biscuits. The children feel very special when these are delivered to the classroom.



St. Valentine's Story

Let me introduce myself. My name is Valentine. I lived in Rome during the third century. That was long, long ago! At that time, Rome was ruled by an emperor named Claudius, I didn't like Emperor Claudius, and I wasn't the only one! A lot of people shared my feelings. Claudius wanted to have a big army. He expected men to volunteer to join. Many men just did not want to fight in wars. They did not want to leave their wives and families. As you might have guessed, not many men signed up. This made Claudius furious. So what happened? He had a crazy idea. He thought that if men were not married, they would not mind joining the army. So Claudius decided not to allow any more marriages. Young people thought his new law was cruel. I thought it was preposterous! I certainly wasn't going to support that law! Did I mention that I was a priest? One of my favourite activities was to marry couples. Even after Emperor Claudius passed his law, I kept on performing marriage ceremonies -- secretly, of course. It was really guite exciting. Imagine a small candlelit room with only the bride and groom and myself. We would whisper the words of the ceremony, listening all the while for the steps of soldiers. One night, we did hear footsteps. It was scary! Thank goodness the couple I was marrying escaped in time. I was caught. (Not quite as light on my feet as I used to be, I guess.) I was thrown in jail and told that my punishment was death. I tried to stay cheerful. And do you know what? Wonderful things happened. Many young people came to the jail to visit me. They threw flowers and notes up to my window. They wanted me to know that they, too, believed in love. One of these young people was the daughter of the prison guard. Her father allowed her to visit me in the cell. Sometimes we would sit and talk for hours. She helped me to keep my spirits up. She agreed that I did the right thing by ignoring the Emperor and going ahead with the secret marriages. On the day I was to die, I left my friend a little note thanking her for her friendship and loyalty. I signed it, "Love from your Valentine."

I believe that note started the custom of exchanging love messages on Valentine's Day. It was written on the day I died, February 14, 269 A.D. Now, every year on this day, people remember. But most importantly, they think about love and friendship. And when they think of Emperor Claudius, they remember how he tried to stand in the way of love, and they laugh -- because they know that love can't be beaten!


World Book Day
