I can hardly believe that this academic year is nearly completed with this penultimate newsletter.

I am pleased to say that we have now competed all of the testing for this year and the results will be shared with you very soon in the end of year reports I am currently reading. We have been moderated this year by the Local Authority as part of their ongoing cycle of moderation and they were pleased with the way the tests were stored,

actual tests observed were good and delivered well as well as looking through training records and additional time to ensure high quality testing.

We have been very busy throughout May and June with the children and the pupils have been incredibly lucky to have enjoyed many trips, visits, residential and visitors to the school. The choir will perform this week at a community event on Saturday. We also look forward to a musical extravaganza where pupils will perform from the music department to show case the pupil's achievements this year with families and friends invited to attend.

Clubs have resumed again for the summer term and I would like to thank staff for staying in their own time after school for the children to enjoy extra-curricular clubs. I am proud we run these as I know a lot of other schools no longer offer clubs to pupils.

Next week the pupils will move into their new year groups for two days to spend time with their new class friends, teacher and teaching assistants and we would like to welcome parents to an evening with the year leader who will send parents a letter to invite them to spend time with them to talk about the year ahead - this will not include teachers, TA's or timetables as we feel this is important for the pupils to know first.
