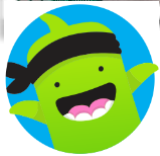

A big thank you to all the staff for their commitment to this as well as to Mrs Urciuoli who has been posting daily Learning By Questions lessons out to the whole school for everyone to get involved with. Alongside this families and pupils have been using IXL, Bug Club, Active Learn and Times Table Rockstars have also seen an increase in engagement as well as a few Zoom lessons and assemblies over the past few weeks. It is so lovely to see so many familiar names as many children who are siblings to the school already will be joining us.
