Welcome back after the half term break, we are well on our way towards the end of the school year now. Where has the time gone?!!

It only seems like 5 minutes ago that we were starting the Summer Term and now we are in our last half term.

many year groups as the children worked towards their end of Year SAT's. We are all incredibly proud of the Year 6 and 2 children for doing an incredible job and putting everything into their tests. We know that whatever the results from these, that you all tried your absolute best, well done everyone. Both year groups enjoyed a special party to mark the end of their tests, we hope you all enjoyed this.

Part way through our Year 6 SATs week, I received a surprising phone call from Ofsted to say that they were going to be making an inspection. Considering that we were in the midst of our Year 6 SATs week, I must admit that this call took us a bit by surprise. I would just like to say a huge thank you to all of the staff and Governors for their incredible support and hard work that they put in and continue to do for our wonderful school. Until the report is published I am unable to tell you much about it, however due to the circumstances of a huge building project, five maternity leaves, pupils not achieving expected predictions in the reading results in last years Year 6 SATs (but looking much more positive for this year) and our Deputy resigning, it has been a challenging year to say the least. Once again, a huge thank you also to the parents for your continued support, encouragement and understanding.

As we look forward the the final half of the Summer term, we have got seven weeks packed full of events and opportunities for children and parents alike. During this first week Year 1 children will visit Burghley Sculpture Park, the staff prepare for the New Reception Intake Parents Evening, some children are off to the Country Dance Festival, Year 5 visit the Black Country Museum and some children will take part in the Peterborough Tennis Club's Mini Tennis Tournament. In addition to all of this, the staff have additional visits from Andy Hawes from the Local Authority who has been working with us on Reading and Elizabeth Pitcher from the Department of Education who is coming to visit us for our Basic Skills Quality Mark renewal.
